






The Creation

mountains appeared.








Noah's Ark

People didn't love God like he wanted, and were not treating one another nicely. So God decided to flood the world. He warned a good man, named Noah.








Then the rain came. It rained for 40 days and 40 nights. The entire Earth was flooded, but everything on the boat was safe. Then the rain stopped.

The king put Joseph in charge of Egypt. Joseph ordered lots of food to be stored. Later, when his brothers had no food, they came to Egypt, where there was plenty.




They were amazed when they saw Joseph. Joseph forgave his brothers. Jacob arrived too, and they all lived happily in Egypt.




The Story of Moses

A new king in Egypt didn't like God's people. They were in danger. To keep her baby son safe, a mother laid him in a basket and left him at the edge of a river.










Moses led the people out of Egypt—but then the king changed his mind and sent soldiers after them! The people had to cross a sea to be safe.



God made a path through the sea. The people followed Moses toward the beautiful land that God had promised.




David and Goliath

Daniel and the Lions




Daniel prayed to God every day. Some powerful people hated Daniel. They told the king to punish anyone who prayed to God.

rule: everyone should pray to God!




The Birth of Jesus

Wise men from the East saw a bright star in the sky. They followed the star to Bethlehem. The wise men wanted to meet the baby born to be king.




When they found baby Jesus, they bowed down and worshipped him. They also gave him presents of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Jesus did amazing things, so thousands of people came to see him. Jesus cared for all those people. He didn't want them to be hungry.




But all they had were five loaves of bread and two fish—not nearly enough.



Jairus' Daughter


Jairus' little girl was very sick. Jairus believed Jesus could make her better, so he begged him to come and help.



The Easter Story




